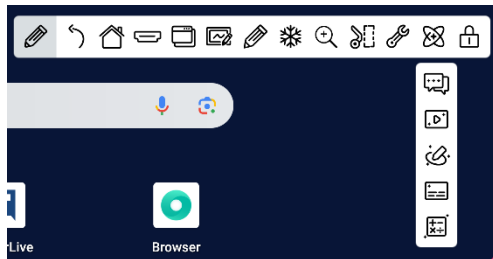

You can find your Clevertouch AI in the floating tool bar.

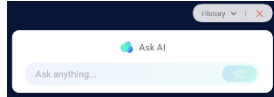


Select the  icon to see your options.

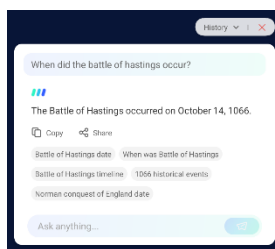


Ask AI

Enter your prompt/question and select the blue send button.

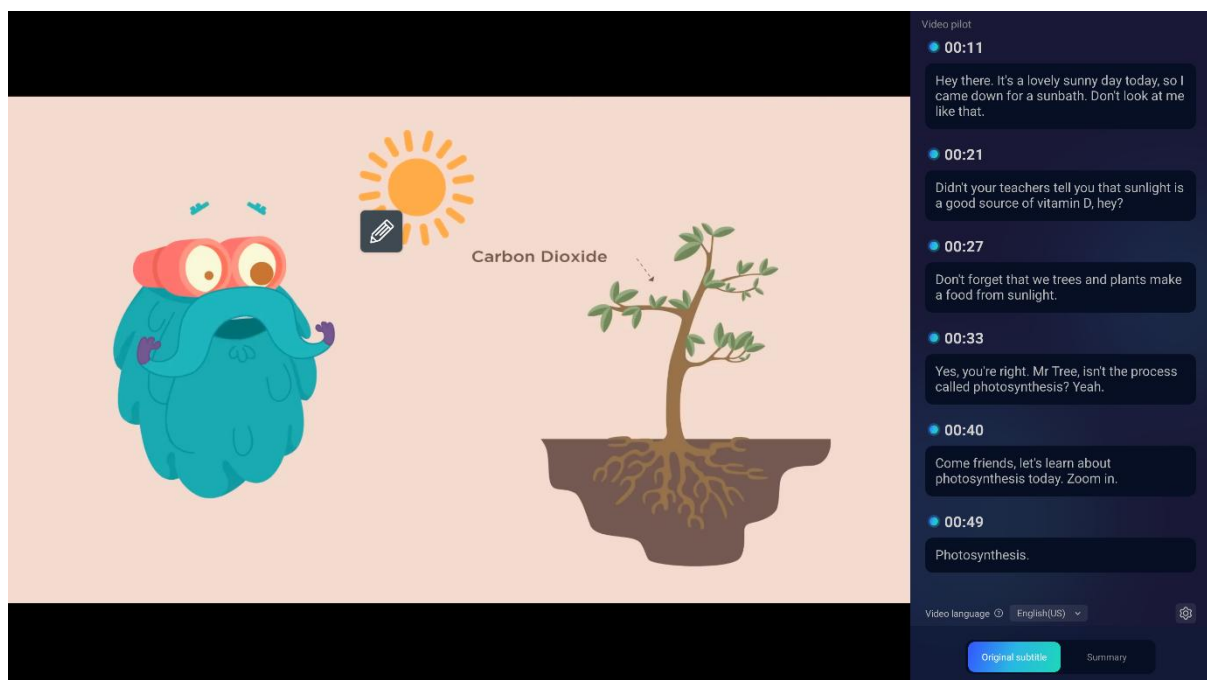


Video Pilot

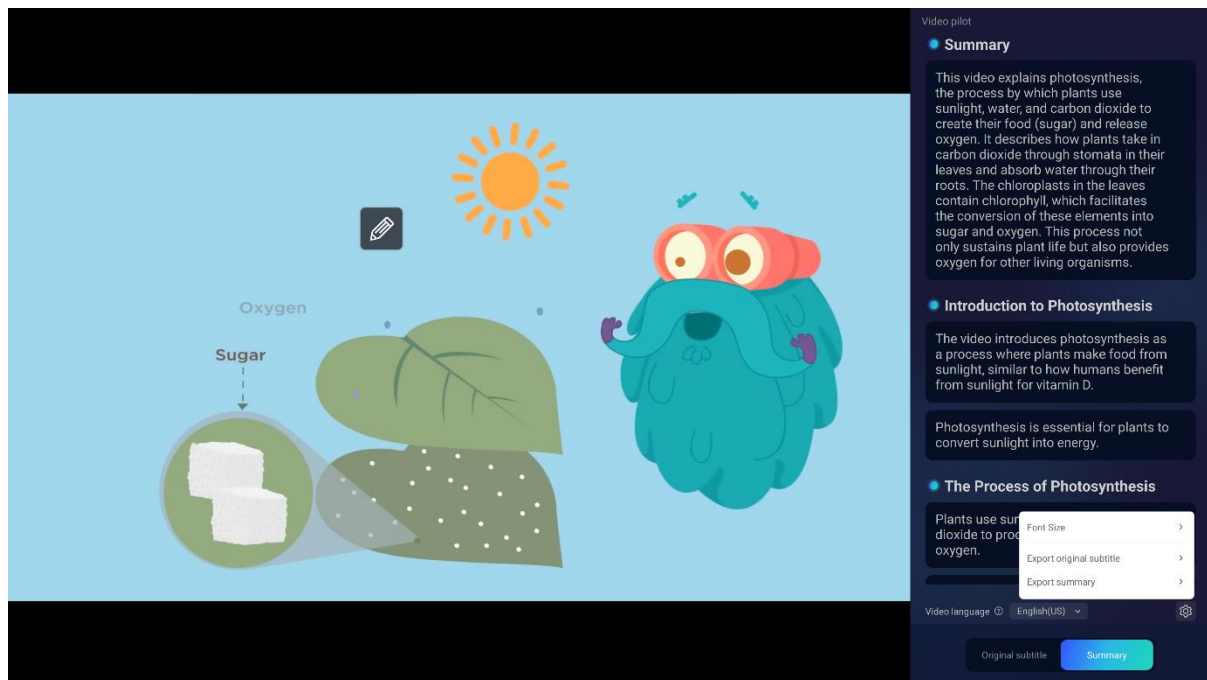
To open Video Pilot select the  icon. Video Pilot will summarise the video you have selected.



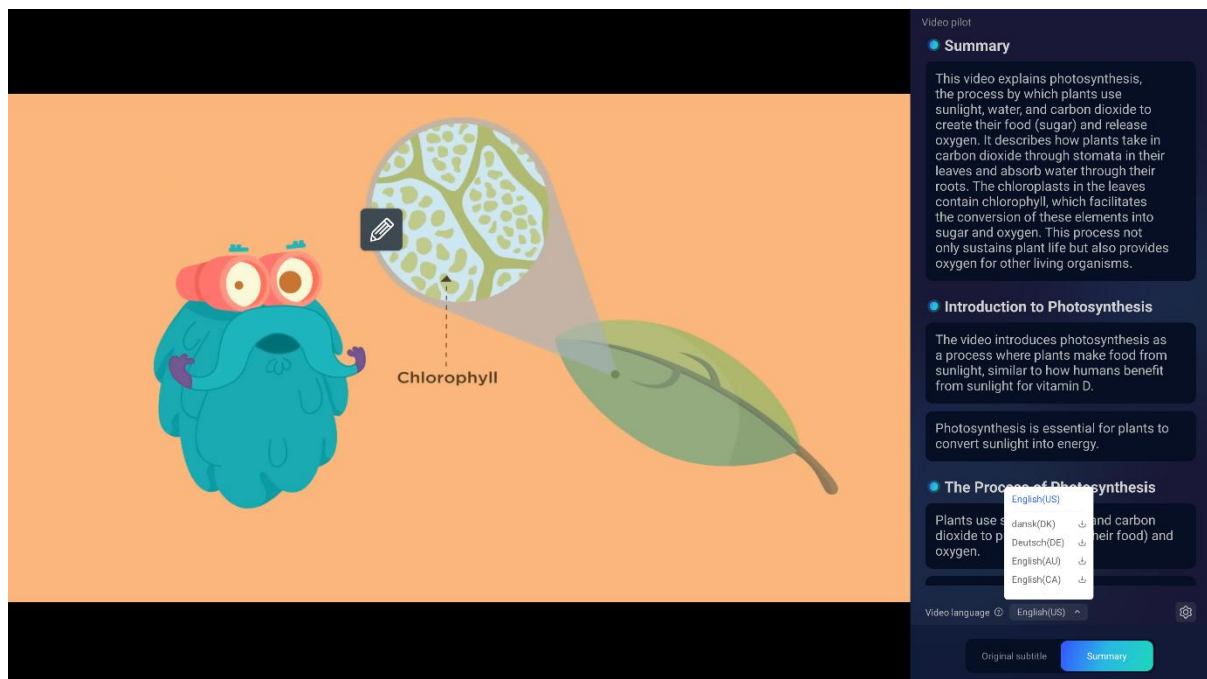
You can also select “Original subtitle” for closed captions.

Find the Area of a Rectangle

To find the area of a rectangle, you multiply its length by its width. In this example, the length is 8 cm and the width is 5 cm. The formula for the area is:

Area = Length x Width = 8 cm x 5 cm = 40 cm²

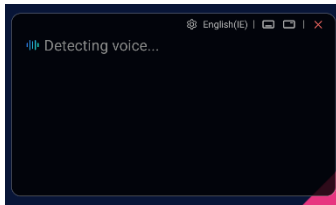

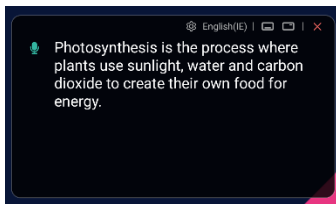
